Holy Cross Parish celebrated its first Mass on Sunday, July 3, 1960 in a small church building donated by Mrs. Yvonne Famel. The church takes its name from a relic of the True Cross which was also donated by Mrs. Famel. In 1966 a new Church building was constructed and the parish moved to its current location on 150th Street. Holy Cross celebrated its 50th anniversary on September 19, 2010 at the dedication and blessing of our new church building.

La parroquia asume su nombre de una reliquia de la cruz donada por la misma persona. En 1966 se contruyó un nuevo templo en la calle 150, dicho templo ahora funciona como centro pastoral. En el 2010 se terminó la construcción del templo actual, y el 19 de septiembre del mismo año se hizo la dedicación en ocasión a la celebración del 50º aniversario de la parroquia, ceremonia presidida por el Obispo Gerald M. Barbarito; siendo pastor el Rev. Nestor Rodriguez.

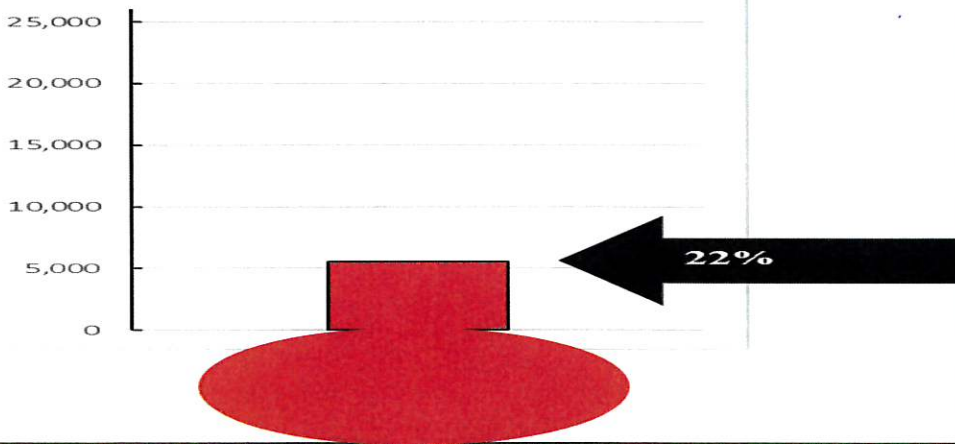

Most Reverend Gerald M. Barbarito's Statement on Pope Francis's Passing

“One of the myriads of wonderful characteristics for which Pope Francis will be long remembered, was his being known as a “Pope of Surprises,” and for presenting a surprise as a joy. While his death was not unexpected, it clearly was a surprise with it occurring immediately after the celebration of Easter and in view of his slow, but positive recovery. It was, as if, he taught us a powerful lesson on the true meaning of hope during this Jubilee Year of Hope which he gave us as we travel in this life as pilgrims of hope. He spent his period of Lent in “fragility,” his own description, and looked forward with great determination, in hope, to the fullness of life, which came to him at Easter. He was a man of tremendous hope, which he lived to the end, and which provided joy to all of us.

So much could be, and will be, said about his tremendous contributions to the life of the Church during his Pontificate. His final message on Easter Sunday, in his Urbi et Orbi address, a few hours before his passing into eternal life, speaks volumes to us at this time. He exhorted:

Christ is risen! These words capture the whole meaning of our existence, for we were not made for death but for life. Easter is the celebration of life! God created us for life and wants the human family to rise again! In his eyes, every life is precious! The life of a child in the mother's womb, as well as the lives of the elderly and the sick, who in more and more countries are looked upon as people to be discarded.

What a great thirst for death, for killing, we witness each day in the many conflicts raging in different parts of our world! How much violence we see, often even within families, directed at women and children! How much contempt is stirred up at times towards the vulnerable, the marginalized, and migrants!

On this day, I would like all of us to hope anew and to revive our trust in others, including those who are different than ourselves, or who come from distant lands, bringing unfamiliar customs, ways of life and ideas! For all of us are children of God!

We pray for our beloved Holy Father, Pope Francis, and we have every confidence to pray to him, as well.”

Declaración del Reverendísimo Gerald M. Barbarito sobre el fallecimiento del Papa Francisco

Una de las innumerables y maravillosas características por las que el Papa Francisco será recordado durante mucho tiempo fue su reconocimiento como un “Papa de las Sorpresas” y por presentar una sorpresa como una alegría. Aunque su muerte no fue inesperada, claramente fue una sorpresa, ya que ocurrió inmediatamente después de la celebración de la Pascua y en vista de su lenta pero positiva recuperación. Fue como si nos hubiera enseñado una poderosa lección sobre el verdadero significado de la esperanza durante este Año Jubilar de la Esperanza que nos dio, mientras viajamos en esta vida como peregrinos de la esperanza. Pasó su período de Cuaresma en “fragilidad”, según su propia descripción, y miró hacia adelante con gran determinación, con esperanza, hacia la plenitud de la vida, que le llegó en la Pascua. Fue un hombre de tremenda esperanza, que vivió hasta el final y que proporcionó alegría a todos nosotros. Se podría decir, y se dirá, mucho sobre sus tremendas contribuciones a la vida de la Iglesia durante su Pontificado. Su mensaje final en el Domingo de Pascua, en su discurso Urbi et Orbi, pocas horas antes de su paso a la vida eterna, nos habla con elocuencia en este momento. Exhortó:

¡Cristo ha resucitado! En este anuncio está contenido todo el sentido de nuestra existencia, que no está hecha para la muerte sino para la vida. ¡La Pascua es la fiesta de la vida! ¡Dios nos ha creado para la vida y quiere que la humanidad resucite! A sus ojos toda vida es preciosa, tanto la del niño en el vientre de su madre, como la del anciano o la del enfermo, considerados en un número creciente de países como personas a descartar. Cuánta voluntad de muerte vemos cada día en los numerosos conflictos que afectan a diferentes partes del mundo. Cuánta violencia percibimos a menudo también en las familias, contra las mujeres o los niños. Cuánto desprecio se tiene a veces hacia los más débiles, los marginados y los migrantes. En este día, quisiera que volviéramos a esperar y a confiar en los demás—incluso en quien no nos es cercano o proviene de tierras lejanas, con costumbres, estilos de vida, ideas y hábitos diferentes de los que a nosotros nos resultan más familiares—; pues todos somos hijos de Dios.

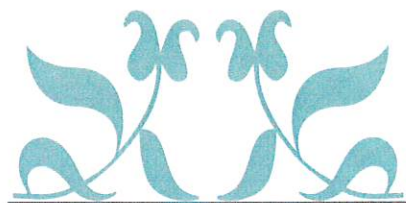

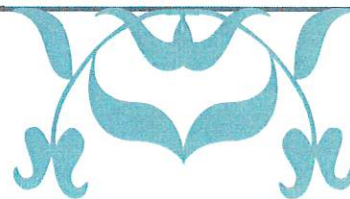
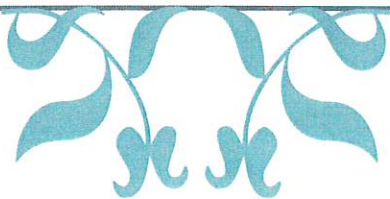
