Holy Cross Parish celebrated its first Mass on Sunday, July 3, 1960 in a small church building donated by Mrs. Yvonne Famel. The church takes its name from a relic of the True Cross which was also donated by Mrs. Famel. In 1966 a new Church building was constructed and the parish moved to its current location on 150th Street. Holy Cross celebrated its 50th anniversary on September 19, 2010 at the dedication and blessing of our new church building.

La Parroquia de la Santa Cruz celebró la primer misa el 3 de julio de 1960 en un templo pequeño donado por la Sra. Yvonne Famel. La parroquia asume su nombre de una reliquia de la cruz donada por la misma persona. En 1966 se contruyó un nuevo templo en la calle 150, dicho templo ahora funciona como centro pastoral. En el 2010 se terminó la construcción del templo actual, y el 19 de septiembre del mismo año se hizo la dedicación en ocasión a la celebración del 50° aniversario de la parroquia, ceremonia presidida por el Obispo Gerald M. Barbarito; siendo pastor el Rev. Nestor Rodriguez.

LENT

Our observance of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, a day of fast and abstinence for Catholics. At Mass on Ash Wednesday (February 18th, 2026), the imposition of ashes replicates an ancient penitential practice and symbolizes our dependence upon God's mercy and forgiveness.

During Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.

The three traditional pillars of Lenten observance are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The Church asks us to surrender ourselves to prayer and to the reading of Scripture, to fasting and to giving alms. The fasting that all do together on Fridays is but a sign of the daily Lenten discipline of individuals and households: fasting for certain periods of time, fasting from certain foods, but also fasting from other things and activities. Likewise, the giving of alms is some effort to share this world equally—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents.

Pastoral Note on Mardi Gras

The celebration of Mardi Gras has its roots in the Christian liturgical calendar as the final day before the beginning of Lent. Traditionally, it was a time of shared joy before entering the forty days of prayer, fasting, and charity that prepare us for Easter.

As a community of faith, we are called to discern the true meaning of this celebration. Christian joy is not opposed to faith; on the contrary, it flows from it. At the same time, every festive expression should respect human dignity, foster fraternity, and never obscure the call to conversion.

Within this tradition, the colors of Mardi Gras also carry a symbolic message that can enlighten our Christian living:

- Purple, a sign of justice, reminds us of the call to live rightly before God and one another.
- Green, symbolizing faith and hope, invites us to trust in the Lord who renews life.
- Gold, expressing power and glory, points us to God's sovereignty and the dignity He bestows upon His children.

We invite the faithful to live these days with balance and responsibility, always remembering that the true center is Christ, who calls us to a renewed heart. May shared joy lead us, with greater awareness, into a fruitful Lenten journey, marked by reconciliation, solidarity, and hope.

Nota pastoral sobre Mardi Gras

(Martes antes de la Ceniza)

La celebración de Mardi Gras tiene su raíz en el calendario cristiano como el último día antes del inicio de la Cuaresma. Tradicionalmente, fue un tiempo para compartir con alegría antes de entrar en los cuarenta días de oración, ayuno y caridad que nos preparan para la Pascua.

Como comunidad de fe, estamos llamados a discernir el sentido auténtico de esta celebración. La alegría cristiana no se opone a la fe; al contrario, nace de ella. Sin embargo, toda expresión festiva debe respetar la dignidad humana, promover la fraternidad y no oscurecer el llamado a la conversión.

En esta tradición, los colores de Mardi Gras también ofrecen un mensaje simbólico que puede iluminar nuestra vivencia cristiana:

- Púrpura, signo de justicia, nos recuerda la llamada a vivir rectamente delante de Dios y de los hermanos.
 - Verde, símbolo de fe y esperanza, nos invita a confiar en el Señor que renueva la vida.
- Dorado, expresión de poder y gloria, nos remite a la soberanía de Dios y a la dignidad que Él concede a sus hijos.

Invitamos a los fieles a vivir estos días con equilibrio y responsabilidad, recordando que el verdadero centro es Cristo, quien nos llama a renovar el corazón. Que la alegría compartida nos conduzca, con mayor conciencia, a un camino cuaresmal fecundo, marcado por la reconciliación, la solidaridad y la esperanza.
